Book Discussion Group

The A+ Active Adults Book Discussion Group meets the **first Monday of each month at 10:00 a.m.** in the A+ room at The Community House. This is a small and friendly group that welcomes newcomers and reads some great selections! Please come by and join us for some interesting discussion.

September 10, 2018 – *Leonardo da Vinci*, by Walter Isaacson. The author of the acclaimed bestsellers *Steve Jobs*, *Einstein* and *Benjamin Franklin* brings Leonardo da Vinci to life in this exciting new biography. Based on thousands of pages from Leonardo’s astonishing notebooks and new discoveries about his life and work, Walter Isaacson weaves a narrative that connects his art to his science.

October 8, 2018 – *The Chicago Picasso A Point of Departure*, by Patricia Stratton. The Chicago Picasso made its debut in downtown Chicago in August 1967 and was immediately recognized as a supreme achievement in monumental sculpture and civic art. Art historian, Patricia Stratton tells the inside story of the sculpture for the first time in this book, published to coincide with the 50th anniversary celebration of the famous unveiling.

November 12, 2018 – *The Path Between the Seas*, by David McCullough. The National Book Award-winning epic chronicle of the creation of the Panama Canal, a first-rate drama of the bold and brilliant engineering feat that was filled with both tragedy and triumph, told by master historian David McCullough. In *The Path Between the Seas*, acclaimed historian David McCullough delivers a first-rate drama of the sweeping human undertaking that led to the creation of this grand enterprise.

December 3, 2018 – *Hunt for Red October*, by Tom Clancy. The #1 *New York Times* bestseller that launched the phenomenal career of Tom Clancy—a gripping military thriller that introduced the world to his unforgettable hero, Jack Ryan—nominated as one of America’s best-loved novels by PBS’s *The Great American Read*. Somewhere under the freezing Atlantic, a Soviet sub commander has just made a fateful decision. The *Red October* is heading west. The Americans want her. The Russians want her back. The chase for the highly advanced nuclear submarine is on—and there’s only one man who can find her.

AARP Driver Safety Program

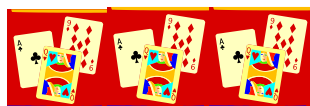

Trips and Events



Houses of Worship - Northside Tour

One of our favorite docents, Al Walavich, will lead us on our tour of churches in the Edgewater area. Our first stop will be The Church of the Atonement, built in 1889.

The architect was the prominent Henry Ives Cobb and whose work includes the Newberry Library and the original University of Chicago buildings. This Church has long been recognized as one of the Diocese of Chicago's leading Anglo-Catholic parishes. The church and its dedicated congregation and clergy have served a changing community and The Church has become an important anchor in a diverse neighborhood.

Also in Edgewater we'll visit St. Andrew's Greek Orthodox Church. In 1953, the parish purchased the corner lot on Hollywood and Sheridan Road and in 1955 the cornerstone laying ceremonies took place. In 1961 decoration of the interior of the church proper began, resulting in the magnificent mosaic of the Virgin Mary, the Pantocrator on the dome, and the delicate designs on the walls and on the column capitals. We'll have lunch at Francesca's on Bryn Mawr before visiting our third church, a north side Catholic Church.
