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

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A Day in Evanston – Halim Glass and Time Museum and Toby Jug Museum



Let's spend the day in Evanston starting off with a visit to the Halim Glass and Time Museum which houses over 1100 time pieces and over 70 stained glass pieces of art. The timepieces include tower clocks, chronometers, automatons, pocket watches and tall case clocks, some over 300 years old. Beautifully restored and preserved, the collection is one of the finest in the world. The building is five stories tall and is filled with history, art and the study of time. The museum is an Egyptian immigrant's own collection purchased from all over the world. After our guided tour, we'll have lunch at Farmhouse in Evanston.



Our next stop will be the Toby Jug Museum also located in Evanston, housing over 8000 Toby and Character jugs; the largest collection of its kind in the world. The collection also contains the World's finest collection of French majolica pitchers, a superb collection of Royal Bayreuth German jugs, and the World's largest collection of more than 1500 Royal Doulton Character and Toby Jugs and Derivatives.

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ACTIVE ADULTS KEY HOLDER PACKAGES

We do ask regular participants in our programs to become Key Holders, and we also welcome the support of anyone who values the existence of programs such as ours in the community.

Key Holders receive newsletters and update flyers by mail. Prices for trips and events are discounted for Key Holders. In addition, you have **FREE** use of The Community House walking track.

Key Holders Fees are \$45 for individuals, or \$65 for couples. To join, please fill out a registration form or mail a slip of paper with your name, full address and phone number and send it with your check, indicating that it is for the A+ Active Adults Key Holder program.

Refund Policy

- All refund requests will be charged a \$10 processing fee. In House credits and program transfers will be charged a \$5 administration fee.
- Refunds will not be given once a ticket to a performance or event has been purchased.
- Refunds will not be granted for withdrawals made three business days prior to the event/trip.
- Individuals who withdraw from a class, program, and event/trip less than five business days prior to the scheduled start date will be charged 75% of the total program fee.
- Refund requests must be approved by the Program Director.
